RAINMAKER ANNOUNCES SUPPORT FOR YOUNG RIDERS AND FUTURE ENTREPRENEURS IN SOUTH AFRICA

CAPE TOWN, December 7, 2017 - Rainmaker Solutions, the digital business transformation specialist, is delighted to announce its support for the Team Bäckstedt HotChillee Development Rider Programme in South Africa.

Team Bäckstedt HotChillee aims to foster young cycling talent in South Africa and Europe, and create a pathway into the pro peloton through a combination of coaching, mentoring, performance testing and racing, with the support of Velokhaya Cycling Academy, Cape Town Giants and others.

As well as providing funding through its charitable Buffalo Foundation, Rainmaker will support Team Bäckstedt HotChillee through the Rainmaker Academy, providing IT support and skills training to equip riders for the future workplace by teaching them to code and developing programming skills.

Buffalo Foundation also supports the KWANO Cycling Academy, which uses cycling as a catalyst to uplift and transform the lives of disadvantaged children and communities in Plettenberg Bay, South Africa, with equipment and funding to pay for after-school teachers.

To mark the occasion, young riders from KWANO were invited to attend the Team Bäckstedt HotChillee Young Rider Summit in Cape Town, to share experiences and hear motivational stories from pro riders, including Team Dimension Data's Nic Dlamini, and of course Magnus Bäckstedt himself. And there was no better way to accomplish this than on bikes up Chapman's Peak.

During the summit, Wattbike donated two of its Wattbike Pro bikes, currently used by the UCI World Cycling Centre in Aigle, Switzerland, and a number of leading sports teams around the world, to the KWANO Academy to help the young riders with their training. It is hoped that many of the KWANO riders will progress to join Team Bäckstedt HotChillee in the future.

Jan Joubert, CEO of Rainmaker Solutions, said: "Cycling provides an opportunity to make a positive difference to the children's lives. The attributes they learn from sport - the importance of hard work, being part of a team, integrity, discipline and accountability - are the same attributes that we look for in business. By giving them additional job skills that will be so important in the future, whether they become pro cyclists or future entrepreneurs, everyone wins."

Team Bäckstedt HotChillee was launched in 2017 as a merger of the HotChillee Development Rider Programme in South Africa and the Bäckstedt Cycling Academy in the UK. The aim is to foster young cycling talent in Europe and South Africa and creating a pathway into the pro peloton.

The HotChillee Development Rider Programme started in 2011 and focused on providing a platform and ecosystem for young talented riders in the Western Cape to make the difficult transition to the pro peloton in Europe. Working in partnership with Wattbike, ORYX Stainless, The Western Cape Government and cycling organisations including Cycling South Africa, the Pedal Power Association, Velokhaya and the Cape Town Giants we enjoyed enormous success with two riders progressing to the Team Dimension Data Continental Team based out of Lucca in Italy.

Many other young riders have also been exposed to what it takes to make the transition with support from of Ben Swift, UAE Abu Dhabi (formerly Team Sky) and guidance from Team Dimension Data riders, Tour de France legend Stephen Roche and Cervelo Bigla rider Ashleigh Moolman.

The Bäckstedt Cycling Academy was set up by Paris-Roubaix winner Magnus Bäckstedt in 2015 to provide an avenue for young cyclists in Europe to reach their full potential on the track and road. The programme has already seen impressive results with a number of British national titles, medals on the track and races being won on the road in Belgium and Sweden.
